## PASTOR'S LETTER

Sitting comfortably at the table, watching the morning news on TV and enjoying my morning cup of coffee, I began to realize that, for most of us, the troubles of those who live far away, are just that - far away. We can certainly sympathize with those who are the innocent victims of the violence and senseless destruction of Isis and the constant shelling of innocent people in the Ukraine. And, while we are grateful it is not happening here, we do feel somewhat removed from it all.

We are sorry about it, but after all, what can we do? Then, I happened to be watching Pope Francis's weekly blessing from St. Peter's Square last Sunday. In his words to the crowd he asked them to pray for those innocent Christians being persecuted by Muslim extremists in many parts of the world. Suddenly the facts became clear. In Iraq and Syria, Egypt, Libya and Nigeria and even North Korea and places like them, Christians are being tortured, kidnapped, driven from their homes and churches, raped, crucified and beheaded because they are Christians and for no other reason. It is hard to imagine why people would do this to one another, but these atrocities go on every day. And, even though our faith in Christ calls us to be a people of hope, we cannot continue to sit back and be grateful it is not happening to us. In many ways, IT IS US. What happens to one Christian affects us all. After all, St. Paul tells us that we are the Body of Christ and that that Body has many parts and that when one part of the Body suffers, we all suffer. (1 Cor.12-12-26)

Lent is the perfect time for us to perform personal acts of charity and prayer and to offer those prayers for those who suffer so unjustly these sins against God's love, our own brothers and sisters who share with us a place in God's family baptized in Jesus Christ.

As Pope Francis said to the crowd, "The dramatic news from Syria and Iraq about violence, kidnapping of persons and harassment against Christians and other groups does not stop. We want to assure those involved in these situations that we do not forget them, but we are close to them and pray insistently that very quickly the intolerable brutality of which they are victims is put to an end."

Let us join with Pope Francis and Bishop Tobin and all our brothers and sisters in faith as we pray that those who suffer so greatly for their faith will not be forgotten, but will be encouraged by our support and prayers.


