HOLY WEEK: As the penitential season of Lent draws to a close, we are entering the holiest of weeks in which we recall the most important events of salvation history: Christ's saving passion, death and glorious resurrection. The liturgies of Holy Week are the most memorable, moving and efficacious of the Church's entire cycle of worship and provide a unique opportunity to enter into the paschal mystery, that is, to identify with Jesus in His suffering (How have we suffered for Christ and His Church?), in His death (Have we died to some particular sin during Lent?) and in His resurrection (Have we grown in self-knowledge, grace and wisdom by our Lenten discipline?).



Palm Sunday: An opportunity to examine our consciences, since we who cry “Hosanna to the Son of David” today may well be the ones who cry out on Good Friday “Crucify Him!” The palms we hold so triumphantly in our hands will become the ashes with which we begin Lent on Ash Wednesday next year. They should remind us how fleeting human respect and praise are, and how much more important it is to honor God in word and deed.



Chrism Mass: On Monday, April 10, at 5:00 PM, Bishop Tobin will celebrate the *Chrism Mass* at the Cathedral of SS. Peter & Paul. All are welcome as the Bishop blesses the holy oils to be used throughout the year at Baptisms, Confirmations and the Anointing of the Sick, as well as witness the priests renewing their priestly promises.



Holy Thursday: *Mass of the Lord's Supper* includes the washing of feet and procession of the Blessed Sacrament to the Chapel of Reposition, where we can keep watch with Christ in our own Garden of Gethsemane. This Mass commemorates the institution of the Sacraments of Holy Orders and Eucharist.



Good Friday: Both the Stations of the Cross and the Liturgy of the Lord's Passion help us appreciate the great sacrifice made by Jesus, out of obedience to the Father and out of love for each and every one of us.
