From the Pastor's Desk

Called to Holiness

"All Christians in any state or walk of life are called to the fullness of Christian life and to the perfection of charity" (Vat II, LG-40-2). All are called to holiness: "Be perfect, as your heavenly Father is perfect" (Mt5:48).

"In order to reach this perfection the faithful should use the strength dealt out to them by Christ's gift, so that...doing the will of the Father in everything, they may wholeheartedly devote themselves to the glory of God and to the service of their neighbor. Thus the holiness of the People of God will grow in fruitful abundance, as is clearly shown in the history of the Church through the lives of so many saints" (Vat II, LG 40-2).

Spiritual progress tends toward ever more intimate union with Christ. This union is called "mystical" because it participates in the mystery of Christ through the sacraments-"the holy mysteries"- and, in Him, in the mystery of the Holy Trinity. God calls us all to this intimate union with God.

In the waters of Baptism, we have been "washed...sanctified...justified in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ and in the Spirit of our God" (1 Cor 6:11). Our Father calls us to holiness in the whole of our life, and since "he is the source of [our] life in Christ Jesus, who became for us wisdom from God, and... sanctification (to make/become holy)" (1Cor 1:30), both God's glory and our life depend on the hallowing of God's name in us and by us. Such is the urgency of the first petition in the Lord's Prayer.

"Our Father who art in heaven, Hallowed be thy Name"

"By whom is God hallowed (made holy), since God is the one who hallows (makes holy)? But since God said, "You shall be holy to me, for I the Lord am holy," we seek and ask that we who were sanctified in Baptism may persevere in what we have begun to be. And we ask this daily, for we need sanctification daily, so that we who fail daily may cleanse away our sins by being sanctified continually...We pray that this sanctification may remain in us" (St. Cyprian, De Dom. orat.12; Lev 20:26).
