## **PASTOR'S PAGE**



Dear Friends in Christ,

Do not be afraid! There are many events that are going on in our world, nation, state and community. Let us remember the words that the Lord repeats throughout Scripture, "Do not be afraid." With the Lord all things are possible. With the Lord we are made new. With the Lord we can persevere in faith, hope and charity. We do this by His grace (His divine life). We have access to many graces and spiritual assistance as children of God. These graces are not limited to global crises, but are offered and given to us throughout our lives. God is with us! Let us continue to draw near to Him.

As we celebrate the Third Sunday of Easter, we are reminded in the Gospel that the Lord walked with two of His disciples along their journey to Emmaus, but they did not recognize Him. "Two of Jesus' disciples were going to a village seven miles from Jerusalem called Emmaus, and they were conversing about all the things that had occurred. And it happened that while they were conversing and debating, Jesus himself drew near and walked with them, but their eyes were prevented from recognizing him." (Luke 24:13-18) Even after all the debating and conversing about the things that happened to Jesus, they did not recognize Him at first. Have we, at times been consumed about all the events around us, and yet, have not recognized that Jesus is standing with us? Let us see these moments as more than isolation and separation, but as a way that God is with us and revealing Himself to us.

On the road to Emmaus, before they recognized the Lord, Jesus explains the Scriptures to them and points at all the references speaking about Him. The Son of Man must suffer and die and rise on the third day! Have we been taking time with the Word of God and reading/praying Scripture? This is a good time to develop a relationship with God through His Word. To pick up a Bible in the house or download an app or visit [usccb.org](http://usccb.org) and click on "Bible" and find the tab "Books of the Bible" and enjoy the Word of God. It truly is His Word to us! It talks about the Lord in the Old Testament and Christ's life in the Gospels of the New Testament. Consider doing a private study or read with the family. You can also read Scripture, the Word of God, when chatting with a friend or family member on video chat. Let us recognize Jesus today!

While meditating and reviewing Scripture, Saint Paul reminds us, "Have no anxiety at all, but in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, make your requests

known to God. Then the peace of God that surpasses all understanding will guard your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus" (Philippians 4:6-7). Please continue to pray daily. Pray the Rosary, Divine Mercy Chaplet and other great devotional prayers and books. Also, keep up with viewing and participating in the Mass on TV or streamed on the internet. Partaking in these tasks daily will remind us and help us to see Him more clearly. Because we may not recognize Him, doesn't mean He is not present. Let us remember the times He has revealed Himself to us. Let us recall all that He has done for us, especially when He loved us so much that He sent us His Son (cf. John 3:16).

Brothers and sisters in Christ, God loves us. Let us trust in His great mercy and love. Let us keep each other in prayer and look forward to the day when we can celebrate together the great Mysteries of our redemption.

The *Regina caeli* is also said in place of the Angelus during Eastertide.
